

## Year 11 Exams

The Mock exams start next week on Tuesday 15 November following on from the November GCSE Maths module for sets 1-3 on Monday morning at 9.00am. Please remember that you can download a timetable from the exams page of Tring School website.

The Mock exams will take place adhering as closely as possible to the conditions of the real thing. The exception will be the way of lining up for the exams. For the Mocks only, students should line up on the playground (in the foyer and drama corridor if wet) in alphabetical order in teaching groups of each subject and they will be registered as they enter the Hall. For the Maths module on Monday they should line up in rows according to their seat number, with row A nearest to the Hobson block.

Some reminders:

- the exams will be invigilated by the Tring School Invigilation team.
- students should arrive **15 minutes** before the published start time so that we can make a prompt start and not over-run into the next session.
- silence must be observed at all times on entering the Desborough block.
- there must be no communication of any kind between students at any time while in the exam room.
- students should bring TWO black pens and any other necessary equipment to each exam. We cannot guarantee to be able to lend out any items forgotten.
- correcting pens must not be used. Highlighters can be used for helping to identify the questions, but not as part of an answer.
- mobile phones and any other unauthorised electronic equipment should not be brought to the exam room.
- we will be following the Exam Board guidelines on behaviour and any misconduct will result in the student re-taking the exam in detention. (I am pleased to say that experience with the modules taken so far by this year group shows that this is unlikely to happen!)
- if you miss an exam, you should turn up to take it in another exam session where it is a subject you do not do.
- if you have a problem during an exam, please raise your hand clearly, without distracting those around you. Please remember that the Invigilators are not allowed to help you in any way with the exam questions.

I would like to wish all Year 11 students the best of luck with these exams.
