August 18 - Be prepared!!

We will be giving out the A2 results in the Common Room. In addition to previous years, we will be opening the Learning Centre for the students to have access to computers to get on to the UCAS website and ensuring that we have a number of telephones available to support students contacting universities.

We would, however, still advise students to come armed with their own mobile phone and contact details for their Firm and Insurance offers, also bringing along a copy of The Independent (for the Clearing list) is always advisable.

If students have not been

successful with their Firm and Insurance choice of university, they will be eligible for Clearing.

The official Clearing vacancies are published on the UCAS website and in the national media from 19 August. Clearing details will be posted up in the Common Room when you collect your results. Be aware that universities will identify spaces 2 – 3 days before this and will generally publish them on their websites

We are confident of student success and fully understand how hard they have worked towards their exams. This year the national trend has seen universities 'upping' their entry criteria after

students have applied and leaving students with no offers.

With places in Higher Education becoming more competitive and the introduction of the A*, we are waiting to see the further implications that this may have on our students. The impact on students collecting results is that if they are unsuccessful in their Firm and Insurance choices they need to dedicate time for the Clearing process and ensure they do not delay in doing so.

Within student results envelopes there will be a letter from the Sixth Form Team, please complete the slip at the bottom and return it that day to the box in the Common Room or, at the very latest, by Friday 26 August to the box in reception.

It is a requirement that we publish all Year 13 student destinations on our website at the start of September. If you wish not to be included in this publication, please notify the Sixth Form Office by Monday 5 September

Year 12 into Year 13 Students

We hope that students achieve the results that they are wishing for. The Sixth Form Team will be available on results day for initial problem solving from 9.30am – 4.30pm in the Common Room.

Details of the start of term arrangements for Year 13, as they will then be, will be in the exam results envelope. In addition there will be a form that students will need to complete as far as possible and they will need to ensure that they bring that in to school on their first day.

Year 13 will also start the new academic year off with a full year assembly in the Dining Hall at 9.00am. They will then each have an individual appointment to check AS grades with subject entry criteria and to discuss if they wish to drop from four subjects to three. After this appointment the students will be able to go home or, if they have a late appointment, they may leave school site and return at the appointment time.

All appointments will be displayed in the Common Room and it is essential that all students are present that day and attend their appointment.

This year A2 subjects have an entry criteria that can be found on the Post 16 area of the school website under entry into Sixth Form. In order to proceed with a subject students must meet the published entry criteria. If a student is studying three subjects and fails to meet the A2 entry criteria in one subject, they must pick up an additional AS subject in order to continue with Sixth Form.

All students **must** have three subjects that can be a combination of A2/AS/GCSE/BTEC. Picking up a new AS will be wholly dependent on class sizes, meeting entry criteria and timetabling. Students that find themselves in this situation must be patient whilst we try to help them with a third subject. It may take slightly longer to resolve but we aim to have all students set for the new academic year by Friday 9 September.

All Year 13 lessons will begin on Wednesday 7 September.

Year 11 into Year 12 Students

We hope that all of the students have an enjoyable summer and a much needed break following their GCSE examinations. Again, we hope that the students achieve the results that they wish for.

The Sixth Form Team will be available on Thursday 25 August 2011 from 9.30am to 4.30pm for any initial problem solving.

Details of the start of term arrangements for all our new Year 12 students will be included in their exam results envelopes.

The new Year 12's are about to embark on 1 or 2 year courses and it is therefore essential that they are confident with their choices and receive all the necessary information and guidance. For this reason they have a longer lead in time prior to their Sixth Form lessons starting.

We will have an individual appointment with each student, so that we can check exam results against subject entry criteria, make any changes if necessary and offer guidance that may be needed. With between 150 and 200 students expected this is a time consuming process, but extremely worthwhile.

The day will start with a full Year 12 assembly in the Dining Hall at 8.40am and then the individual appointments will begin from 9.45am. A list of appointments and timings will be displayed in the Common Room and students will be free to go once they have had their appointment or, if they have a later appointment, they can go off school site and return at the appropriate time. Please note that all Maths students will also be completing a test at 10am that day for 'setting' purposes.

On Thursday 8 September, all students who are due to study a subject at Ashlyns School need to be in school at 8.25am, they will then be transported to Ashlyns for an induction. Once again this is useful to ensure that students have computer log-ins, are aware of all the Sixth Form facilities available at our partnership school and have familiarised themselves with the school and the transport arrangements. They will return to Tring at 11.00am where we will register them for the transport provided between the two schools in the Common Room.

In addition, on the Thursday from 12.00 noon, we will have additional appointments with the Year 12 students who are still struggling to sort their Sixth Form options out. Therefore, if students are not studying a subject at Ashlyns and have no issues to resolve, they are not required in school on Thursday.

All Year 12 lessons start on Friday 9 September with normal registration at 8.40am.

Late Applications

Late applicants should ensure that they come into school for 8.40am, we will meet each student for individual appointments

Book Collection & Leavers Forms

All Year 13's need to have completed a Book Collection & Leavers Form. Many students have already done so, thank you. There are still a number that are outstanding, and we have telephoned these students directly. Each year there is a small minority of students, who do not return their text books, these have to be replaced and, therefore, there is a direct cost to the school.

We would greatly appreciate parental support in this matter; if your son or daughter has not returned their text books please can you ensure that they do so before the end of term, Friday 22 July. If they have lost the text books then they will need to pay for the cost of the book.

Replacement Book Collection forms can be obtained from the Sixth Form Office. Failure to return the form may result in a delay of issue A level certificates being issued. We appreciate your co-operation in this matter

Presentation of A2 Certificates

We will be presenting our Year 13 leavers with their A2 certificates on the evening of Friday 4 November 2011.

This is a truly joyous occasion. Most of the students who have gone to university will be making their first trip home after six weeks or more, so it is a fantastic opportunity for the year group to catch up. This is always popular with students and parents alike, the evening starts at 7.30pm and is followed by drinks in the Dining Hall.

University and alternatives to university

We have done much work since April with Year 12 students on 'Life after Sixth Form' and we will be continuing this work throughout the Autumn term. Following on from a successful trip to the Hertfordshire Higher Education Convention in July, most students, who are considering university as an option, have logged onto UCAS and started their application.

Students also attended the Careers Fair at Ashlyns School, organised as a collaborative project between our two schools. The students were able to choose the most relevant seminars and presentations to attend during the day ranging from: Understanding apprenticeships to Why go to University. We also had a number of industries attending with presentations on A career in Modern News Media; Careers in Sport; STEM Aerospace & Civil Eng; Careers in the Army; A Career in Geography; Careers in Health; IT in Banking & Finance/Accountancy; Careers in Law; Acting and many more.

The day was very exciting and hopefully made the students aware of all the opportunities available to them.

We strongly advise students to book a 'mock interview' with Connexions. These commence from September and are invaluable. They need to see Mrs Griffiths in Connexions along with their Personal Statement/CV to arrange an appointment as soon as possible.

It is worth noting that we check all UCAS applications and references thoroughly; this process can take up to three weeks. Therefore, when a student pays and presses the 'send' button, they are sending it to the Sixth Form Team and need to factor in that it could take up to three weeks for their application to reach UCAS.

We do process all applications as quickly as possible. It is also worth being aware that if any errors are picked up on applications, we cannot change them – we have to send the application back to the student for them to make any amendments and then send it back to us. It is therefore essential that students regularly check both their UCAS account and their email accounts.

Dress Code for Sixth Form

Last September we introduced a 'smart' dress code, this was to fall in line with the rest of Dacorum and to also have a smarter more professional looking Sixth Form.

Since this was introduced the boys have adhered to it and look extremely smart, this has been a noticeable improvement by both the school and the community. However, enforcing the girls dress code has been a much more difficult task due to the vast range of options available to them. At times it has felt very unfair on the young men as the girls have been seen to be getting away with clothing far from smart.

Due to the difficulties we have faced and the time wasted on conversations regarding clothing, we have decided to further smarten up the girls' dress code, provide much clearer guidelines and our aim is to improve the appearance of the girls to fall in line with the boys, and save the many conversations about skirt length and lycra!

Students who do not adhere to the dress code will be sent home to change and will therefore not be able to access their lessons; therefore it is the student's responsibility to come to school appropriately dressed.

From September 2011 the following guidelines will apply to the girls:

- Smart business trousers / skirt / dress (all of appropriate length)
- Shirt or blouse
- Cardigan / jumper
- Smart shoes (work / school type)

Absolutely no lycra will be tolerated and all clothing should be 'office' appropriate.

No extremes of style in terms of hair, jewellery or make up. The only visible piercings are to be for earrings.

The manner of student dress should not draw attention to the student, be offensive or be off putting to staff who teach or other students.

Community Help

Over the last couple of years our Sixth Form Community Help Programme has gone from strength to strength. Two years ago we introduced the Bronze (20 hours), Silver (35 hours) and Gold (50 hours) certificates for Community Help.

The certificates not only give something for the students to aim towards, they also recognize and reward those students who go above the minimum expectation of 20 hours.

We recently launched the programme to the Year 12 students, who will work towards these awards from now and throughout Year 13. Last year we introduced the I-card to log all the students community hours, in line with the certificates that we have; bronze, silver and gold.

These I-Cards make the logging of student hours easier and the administration task much simpler. We are pleased to say that the breadth of Community Help has extended considerably; meaning that many hours can be accrued in school simply by assisting in lower school lessons.

The programme has many opportunities both in school and the wider community; for instance within school students have the opportunity to academically mentor younger students, assist in numerous departments with lower school lessons, assisting at the homework club, supporting reprographics, working as a literacy assistant and many more. Out of school students can volunteer for the St Francis Hospice, work with young disabled people in the community, volunteer to work in local primary schools along with many other opportunities that we have published to our students. Indeed we know that many of our students already volunteer help at Beavers, Brownies, Cubs, Guides, Sailing clubs, sports clubs and youth clubs and we are very proud that they are such pro-active citizens

All the Year 12 students have been issued with their I-card to record the hours that they complete and we are delighted to report that a number of students have already completed 20 hours and are well on their way to their silver award – congratulations to Georgia Burn, Jonnie Downs, Sophie Padmore, Rebecca Pavlik, Alex Ray and Gabriella Wesley. Special congratulations to Ian Doughty who has already surpassed 50 hours – well done Ian!

Results Days

Please see notes above and below for dates and times of GCSE/AS/A2 examination results.

We would like to make parents aware that Mr Freeman has emailed all current Year 12 and Year 13 students the information that they need with regards to results enquiries and the return of marked papers. Please be aware that if students wish to request a photocopy of a script they should do so using the form emailed by Mr Freeman, along with payment by Friday 26 August. Photocopies should be received by the school by Friday 9 September and any enquiry made through Mr Freeman by Monday 19 September

The original scripts can also be requested using the appropriate paperwork and sending in the appropriate fee; this request to Mr Freeman must take place by Thursday 29 September. Scripts will not be received until mid November.

Mr Freeman has also made students in Year 13 aware of a new scheme that is running this summer whereby AQA will be offering a 'Priority Re-marking Scheme' which will enable students to apply for re-marks which will guarantee a re-mark by the end of August. Applications for this must be submitted to Mr Freeman by 22 August.

Important Information for Year 13 Students

UCAS has asked us to remind students that they should not try to access UCAS Track at midnight on 17/18 August – the only system available at that time will be the Clearing vacancy search. Students may be able to access Track from 7am, however, experience has shown that the UCAS site can be difficult to access with over three quarter of a million students trying to log on!

We would recommend that students check emails that morning as UCAS will send out a letter of acceptance from relevant universities as soon as they can.

Student Badges – September 2011

The school, as a whole, is working on improving the safeguarding procedures to ensure that Tring School remains a safe place to study. It will now become a requirement for all Sixth Form students, staff and visitors to wear a photo badge.

The school is quite an open site and has a large number of visitors each day, therefore it is crucial that we are able to identify Sixth Form students staff and visitors from intruders.

During the first week of term every Sixth Form student will have their photo taken and shortly after badges will be issued. The badge will become a compulsory part of the school uniform and like any other uniform offence, if a student is not wearing their badge they will be sent home to get it. Badges will be provided free of charge in the first instance, but students will need to pay for replacement badges

Student Planners – September 2011

We recognise that the students joining our Sixth Form have held a Tring School Planner for the previous five years, however we also recognise that as young adults, our Sixth Form students should take responsibility for themselves and their learning.

In light of this Sixth Form students should provide their own planner/diary, from September 2011, to note down all homework, coursework, deadlines, meetings and appointments. As always, this needs to be brought into school every day and available for Form Tutors, staff and Sixth Form Team to see.



The Extended Project Qualification

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a relatively new qualification that we have offered Year 12 students to take in Year 13. Students have to plan, manage and deliver a project on a topic of their choice. This is a fantastic opportunity for students to pursue an area of interest as well as prepare themselves for university. They have complete autonomy over the project – a daunting and exciting experience!

Several students have taken on the project for next year – with a variety of topics from creative writing to politics. These students have a lot of hard work to do on top of their A-levels – intense research on their topic, before producing either a 5000 word dissertation or an artefact and 1000 word report. They will have to make presentations on their project after completion.

Students that are taking the EPQ have been set research to do over the summer – to ensure they're ready to submit a proposed question to their supervisor in September. If your child is taking the EPQ please support them by ensuring they are completing their research over the next few weeks.

Six Expectations

Students make a conscious decision to stay on in Sixth Form and as such there are increased expectations placed upon them. It is our aim that we are not only equipping students with exam results but also skills for the rest of their lives.

At Tring we are very good at doing too much for the students which can be detrimental in the long term! We would therefore like to be clear on the expectations with the main aim being that students take responsibility for their learning. In light of this below are our expectations for all students for the forthcoming academic year.

1. Students are to be punctual and attend all registrations and lessons, with a minimum attendance of 90% to all taught lessons. Students who are to be out of school for valid reasons must ensure that they notify all staff in advance and complete work missed. All students must adhere to the Home Study policy.
Failure to meet the minimum 90% attendance to individual subjects will result in paying for exams in this subject (with the exception of extenuating circumstances) This will be applied to both January and summer modules. Students off site outside Home Study hours will be given a lunchtime detention
2. Students arrive fully prepared for lessons.
*Students are **not** allowed to join the lesson if homework / preparation work is not completed to the required standard, or just not completed. Students will be sent away to complete the work and must return as soon as they have completed the work, at which point they can be readmitted to the lesson.*
3. Students are to take responsibility for their own learning and be proactive in seeking help.
This includes seeing teachers outside of lessons if they are struggling with any work, organising 1:1's as necessary and managing the demands of Sixth Form study.
4. Students are to adhere to the Sixth Form dress code, including wearing the Sixth Form badge.
Failure to dress appropriately will result in students being sent home.
5. Students are not allowed to use mobile phones within lessons unless instructed by the teacher, and only for the purpose of recording homework / work related to lesson.
On any occasion a student uses their mobile phone it will be confiscated as per the following.
 - *First offence – 1 day confiscation*
 - *Second offence – 2 day confiscation*
 - *Third offence – 3 day confiscation etc, etc*
6. Students are required to check emails daily
